The D-NIX EXTENSION PACKAGE is running under the UNIX System V.2 compatible D-NIX system on the complete range of DS90 computers from Diab Data. The package includes basic and advanced utilities, communication and development programs as well as a documenter's workbench which is a set of utilities dedicated to sophisticated text processing.
The D-CC CROSS ENVIRON-

MENT enables program development for 68010 computers to be performed in a 68020 or 68030

environment.

The D-NIX POSIX EXTENSION PACKAGE provides the user with a program development environ-ment, based on D-NIX version 5.2, that is closely conforming to the POSIX 1003.1 standard, as published in the IEEE standard 1003.1 -1988.

D-NIX EXTENSION PACKAGE

Shell command interpreter

Two command language interpreters, the standard Bourne shell and the Berkely C shell are provided in the system.

Compilers and debuggers

The software package provides C (dcc) language compiler, an assembler (as), and powerful symbolic debuggers (adb and sdb). The generated object code is in COFF format, which allows for object compatibility among families of microprocessors.

Program development facilities

Powerful utilities such as lint, prof, and make, help reduce actual programming time. The lint utility identifies parts of a program that deviate from standard programming techniques. prof profiles an application to show where a program is least efficient, and make automates compilation when developing a modular software system. When modifying a program, make reduces both programmer's effort as well as the processing load on a system by examining the overall source and automatically rebuilding and relinking only those parts that are affected by the modification. The advantages of make are even greater in large-scale software projects where numerous programmers are involved in its development. The standard directories libc and libm are provided. The package also includes over 100 useful utilities making software development much easier.

Source Code Control System SCCS is an effective tool for managing the coding and maintenance of software development projects. It enforces revision check by archiving, version numbering and time stampling all software and documentation changes. Any version of the software or documentation can be automatically retrieved.

Editors

The software package includes both interactive screen (D-MACS, vi) and line-oriented (ed,ex) editors as well as a variety of batch-oriented tools (grep, sed, sort...) for sophisticated text manipulation.

Documenter's workbench

Provides a variety of sophisticated text processing tools that transform text created by the editors into formatted output suitable for printing or photo typesetting.

System activity reporter

This tool provides automatic measurement and reporting of system-wide activities to aid in fine-tuning the system.

Accounting utilities

This set of tools optionally monitors, reports and allocates fees for prime and non-prime time system resource usage.

Remote UNIX communication

Commands such as cu (included in the basic package) and uucp allows D-NIX users to log onto or/and transfer files to other systems running UNIX software. Connection can be made either through RS-232C or over an Ethernet network.

D-CC CROSS ENVIRONMENT

D-CC is an addition to the D-NIX Extension Package for use in the DS90-20 and DS90-21 computers. With the D-CC, programs for 68010 computers (DS90-1X) can be developed in a 68020 or 68030 computer (DS90-2X/3X).
